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

KAB HOSTS WATER WEEK SYMPOSIUM

The Uganda Water and Environment Week (UWEWK) is a week-long annual event that is organized by the Ministry of Water and Environment (MWE) through the Water Resources Institute (WRI). The UWEWK has become a WRI flagship program and provides an interface between sector stakeholders for knowledge exchange, dialogue, and learning for the improvement of Uganda's water and environment resources. The event integrates physical and virtual activities that take place both before and during the week, to

engage and exchange information on water and environment management and development in general and across various sectors of the economy.

This year's southwestern Uganda celebrations were hosted in the Kabale district under the theme 'Water and Environment for Peace and Socioeconomic Transformation of Uganda'. Among the many activities that took place, was a scientific symposium and student debate that were both hosted by Kabale University (KAB). There was also an exhibition by the ministry and other key stakeholders.

In her remarks before opening the symposium, the Kabale University Vice-chancellor, prof. Joy C Kwesiga welcomed the guests to the symposium. She emphasized the issue of sustainable use of environmental resources to avoid loss of soil fertility. She mentioned how the KAB strategic plan highlights the issue of sustainability. She pointed out the University 's efforts in supporting the farmer field schools, and focus on research. She emphasized KAB's commitment to continue working with various stakeholders to ensure we keep a safe environment.

KAB HOSTS VISITORS FROM ABSA BANK

On Wednesday 15th March, Kabale University hosted a team of visitors from the ABSA bank Head Office and Kabale Branch. The team was led by the ABSA Kabale bank branch Manager Mr Nicholas Turyamuhaki. 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KAB And MAK Explore Ways Of Working Together On Research

Kabale University in March hosted a team from the Makerere University Research Innovations Fund. The team held meetings with different stakeholders at KAB. They discussed ways to engage and assess possible avenues of collaboration for research and innovations. In the opening meeting where they met with members of the University Management, Heads of Faculties, Directorates, and institutes, they expressed optimism about the growth of research at KAB.

The Team was led by Dr. Zahara Nampewo and Professor Robert Wamala who shared their experience at the Makerere University Research and Innovations Fund. Key to note was the ability to use government-granted research funds appropriately to expand the University's publication abilities. The Director for Research and Publication, Prof Natal Ayiga was thankful for the team and appealed to them to maintain an open working relationship that will see KAB's research promoted to another level.

In his remarks, the Deputy Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs Prof. Benon Basheka pointed out the strategic location of KAB as a unique research hub. The University 's geographic location places it in an environment of great research potential given the multi-ethnic wealth in the neighbouring countries of Congo, Rwanda, Burundi, and Tanzania. He emphasized that research funding and collaboration should target harnessing the individual capacity of researchers and the institutional capacity of KAB.

The team held an in-depth discussion to familiarize themselves with KAB's research readiness. They discussed procedures for managing research grants, research dissemination, community engagement, and key challenges of the region.

FROM KABALE TO BESANÇON-FRANCE

Kabale University has a longstanding relationship with the French Embassy in Uganda. Under this relationship, we have received several equipment to support learning at KAB. The French Embassy has supported several student & staff projects at KAB. As one of the activities sponsored by the French Embassy under FSPI (Solidarity Fund for Innovative Projects) entitled; French *as a language of Communication "French as a language of Education, Consolidating the learning of French in a University environment*", a fund was allocated for two people to go for a two-weeks training programme in French for Specific Purposes (FOS) and French as a Foreign Language (FLE) in France.

The training was to equip participants and teachers of French with modern and better teaching and learning skills of the language. Two candidates, Ms. Christine Kyomukama, a Teaching Assistant and Patron of the French Club, and Ms Sarah Kabugho, a Year III student of Bachelor of Arts with Education- French and Geography represented the French Department in the training in Besançon-France. On the 26th March 2022, Prof. Joy C. Kwesiga and Prof. Manuel Muranga, and a good many other people from Kigezi and elsewhere attended the launch of a book in Rukiga-Runyankore entitled "Ntebeza eby'Aba Kare" by John Twinomusinguzi. This was at the home of Mr and Mrs John Twinomusinguzi, in Bulindo, Kiira, Wakiso District. John Twiunomusinguzi was at the same time celebrating his 80th birthday, which fell on 23rd March. The book adds to the scarce sources of Rukiga-Runyankore books. Mr Twinomusinguzi is a retired economist and corporate manager having served as the Head of Uganda Development Bank and a Senior Officer in the Commonwealth Secretariat in London. His

literary skills were lauded by Prof. M. Muranga of the Institute of Language Studies, Kabale. University. As you will note from the photo, the book launch event was attended by many distinguished people of Kigezi. The Chancellor Kabale University, Prof. G. of Mondo Kagonyera, officiated at the ceremony. The book contains rhymes, proverbs and folktales of the Bakiga, taken with due acknowledgment largely from the linguistically excellent works of the late Omugurusi Festo Karwemera (1925-2020), who was in 2018 awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Literature of Kabale University. Twinomusinguzi provides amazingly beautiful English renderings and interpretations of four well-known folktales ("Ka nze kusheenyera taata, azaire"; "Etakabaagirwe teba nyama";

"Naakutanga okuzimu, wantanga kunuuka"; and "Oburungi tigwo mutima"); language-based explanations of 27 common proverbs; as well as concise introductory commentaries on 23 rhymes, many of which most Bakiga who grew up within the Rukiga-speaking environment will be familiar with. e.g. "Kaamushungushungu", "Nzinira Rutuuhe", "Kiisamutuutu", "Mp' enkoni, mp' enkoni, mp' enkoni". A word of appreciation must go to the editor of the book, Olivia Kim Kamarebe, who is the author's daughter, which, by the way, shows how successful Mr Twinomusinguzi has been in passing on his native language to posterity - an example we should all follow. The two illustrators, John Baptist Tumuhaise and Patricia Businge, also deserve special mention: their beautiful, very expressive colour illustrations are without doubt examples of some of the finest of this type of art. With this book, John Twinomusinguzi has earned himself a secure place among the promoters of our language and culture. May he go on to produce more work of this genre!





LITERATURE STUDENTS CELEBRATED THE INTERNATIONAL MOTHER LANGUAGE DAY

Kabale University second-year students celebrated literature International Mother Language Day on the 21st of February in their own style. They gathered to listen to poetry in Rukiga written by Racheal Atuheire and recited by Olivah Atukunda. The thirty minutes celebration took place at the main campus of Kabale University on Kikungiri hill, outside Sarah Ntiro block.

International Mother Language Day is celebrated worldwide. For the second-year Literature students, led by their lecturer, Prof. Egara kabaji, it was a time to celebrate through poetry and dance. The theme for this year's Mother Language Day is "Using technology for multilingual learning; challenges and opportunities."

According to Barnabas Akimanzi, the class coordinator," it was a good experience to celebrate our language, "It was his view that we set aside time every year to celebrate mother language day. This is one of the unique opportunities that Kabale University offers students through its various learning programmes. The ability for the students to be able to appreciate and promote their native languages is a greatly cherished opportunity in many professions.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE HOLDS CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOPS

In keeping in line with its mandate of empowering students with a multiplicity of skills, Kabale University has launched a creative writing project. The project, which will involve a series of workshops, is running from February to May 2022. The workshops are intended to equip all students interested in creative writing with the skills to write a variety of literary works. Prof. Egara Kabaji, a visiting Scholar from Kenya on the Inter-University Council of East Africa (IUCEA) Mobility Programme, spearheads this project. Dr Constance Tukwasibwe, the Head of the Department of English Language, officially launched the project.



Prof. Egara Kabaji, a renowned scholar and creative writer, will be running the workshops until May 2022 when, it is expected, that the participants will have acquired the necessary skills to write publishable creative works. Speaking during the launch, Prof. Egara Kabaji, noted that the 21st century has created many opportunities for creative writers to prosper. "There are so many opportunities for marketing creative works," He argued that only those who are determined and ready to work hard will succeed as writers. "Writing is an intensive process. It is one percent inspiration ninety-nine and percent perspiration," he said.

Quoting Sydney Sheldon, the re-known prolific American writer, Prof. Kabaji asked students not to start with hope for big money from writing. "Money follows success in mastering the skills and writing well". Prof Kabaji said.

He emphasized that it is important to set up a disciplined schedule if you have to complete your project. Those interested in becoming writers should not only write when the muse sits on their shoulders. Kabaji noted that there are two kinds of writers: those who want to write and those who have to write". Many people want to be writers but they are not ready to pay the price of being writers.

Prof. Kabaji noted that writing is an exciting profession. The writer can play the role of a god. He creates his exciting worlds and puts people and other wonderful creatures in this world, which he controls.

The workshops are meant to arouse the imagination of aspiring creative writers and infuse a variety of qualities important for a writer. These qualities include persistence, perseverance, empathy, style patience, hard work, and a sense of purpose.

In her remarks, Dr Constance Tukwasibwe thanked the students for embracing the programme. She asked the participants to find a way of sustaining the programme even after Prof. Egara Kabaji's visit ends in May 2022. Through their representative, Nyakato Sylvia, the student expressed their gratitude for the initiative. "The program will enable us to discover our hidden potential as creative writers," she said



CANADIAN SUPPORT TO BOOST KAB'S EFFORTS OF TAKING LEARNING TO LEARNERS

Kabale University (KAB), together with other partners, is offering a custom-tailored learning opportunity to in-service teachers in southwestern Uganda! This flexible e-Learning programme shall allow in-service teachers to acquire a Bachelor in Primary Education (BEP) degree by studying at their convenience and pace, without having to travel to the University (except for examinations). This partnership has been greatly boosted by a donation from the Canadian government, and the implementation is supported by the Canadian Institute of Mass Communication (CIMC).

Under this highly flexible and contextualized learning programme, enrolled teachers will receive distance education through Educational Lecture Videos (ELVs) provided on computers at a Local Study Centre. Students who cannot come to the Study Centres, particularly women, will be given Mobile Video Players (containing the ELVs) along with solar power chargers so that they can study from the comfort of their homes or workplaces. There have been collaborative efforts to develop instructional material which will also be provided to students. A well-furnished state-of-the-art e-Learning centre of excellence is being set up at Kabale University under this project.

On 31 January 2022, Mr Santosh Shail, Executive Director of the Canadian Institute of Mass Communication (CIMC), officially handed over to Kabale University the following equipment, donated bv the Government of Canada, for the implementation of the "Blended E-Learning Project for the **Empowerment of Women in** Uganda". Among others, this equipment included:

- Full set of Audio-Visual Equipment for the production of Education Lecture Videos, including 2 laptops, 2 video cameras, 2 lapel microphones, 2 lights, tripods, headphones, external speakers, and accessories
- 30 All-in-one Desktop Computers for District Study Centres of Kabale University
- 6 portable External Hard Disk Drives (HDD) of 5TB storage capacity each, for storage of ELVs and transfer to Study Centres
- 30 SD Card Reader Adapters
- 250 micro SDXC Flash Cards (64GB) with Adapters

- 250 Mobile Video Players (hand-held devices) with earphones
- 250 Solar Charger devices (to charge the video players)

This project is designed to test an innovative solution that promotes gender equality and empowers women in the teaching profession in Uganda. It is a direct response to the recently approved National Teacher Policy that threatens to exacerbate gender disparities in a largely patriarchal country such as Uganda. It is a trial run of an innovative locally-driven prototype technology solution to measure behavioral changes in target beneficiaries (women in-service teachers) in selected districts of southwestern Uganda, aiming to validate the test results for future scalable and replicable applications for greater impact.

Specifically, the project is testing a two-pronged solution that involves: i) widespread sensitization and capacity-building campaigns that highlight the importance of women's socioeconomic participation in Uganda; and ii) a cost-effective, blended, and decentralized e-learning program that will allow women to upgrade their teaching certifications without having to travel to universities or regularly access the Internet. The project is hosted at the Kabale University Faculty of Education, and implemented in partnership with Global Affairs Canada, the Canadian Institute of Mass Communication

(CIMC), CEED Concordia, and Action for Development (ACFODE).

The results of this test project will provide critical insight into the potential for transformative change Uganda's education in system using a communitydriven blended learning solution that seeks to dismantle gender barriers empower and women Teachers to continue their participation in the workforce.

Prof. EGARA KABAJI obtained his PhD degree from The University of South Africa



Kabaji contributes on a multiplicity of platforms including publications in refereed journals, books, broadcast, and print mass media. He a public intellectual who writes is passionately on literature, culture, and education. Prof. Kabaji is perhaps one of the most prolific writers of children's literature in Kenya with over thirty publications. Prof. Kabaji is a Fulbright Scholar. His latest venture is the establishment of EGARA KABAJI TV, a YouTube Channel dedicated to research and academic content.

SANTOSH SHAIL is Director of the Canadian Institute of Mass Communication (CIMC), a non-profit organization that develops and manages Learning Management Systems for relevant, affordable. and convenient distance education. He has comprehensive experience in the production of broadcast media in the genres of educational television, documentaries, public service announcements. News. telefilms. and corporate publicities. He has worked on international development projects for the World Bank, UNESCO, UNICEF, and WHO. He has served as an Educational Media Consultant for the Indira Gandhi National Open University. India. and the Commonwealth of Learning, Canada. Santosh received the 2007 'International Media Achievement Award' in India, in recognition of his accomplishments in global education projects, and for enabling capacity building in developing communities in India and Ethiopia.

Santosh is also President of Shails Communications Inc., a Canadian company incorporated in 1998, specializing in content creation for broadcast television and digital media, combining a wide range of ICT expertise, including interactive broadband streaming delivery. DR RICHARD SHAFER is a Washington State University Graduate Writing Centre consultant and editor. He is also an Emeritus Professor of Journalism. He was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship to establish a similar writing centre at Kabale University (KAB). Dr Shafer also lectures and conducts science and medical writing seminars and workshops. He is an Emeritus Professor of Journalism at the University of North Dakota. He has conducted journalism courses and workshops in over 40 countries for Fulbright, Soros Foundation, and the US State Department.

Shafer sites the WSU Graduate Writing centre as a model for preparing graduate students to successfully conduct and publish their research. It is also a resource for faculty members who supervise postgraduate students. According to Shafer, the additional editing and writing services provided by the centre can save graduate committee members a great deal of time otherwise spent helping the student refine their writing to complete a thesis or dissertation, or formulate a successful academic paper or journal article.

Kabale University has new but dynamic undergraduate and graduate programs that can benefit from the establishment of a writing centre that furthers research and publication, as well as its national and international reputation. In this regard, the visit of Dr Richard Shafer is timely. He is working together with Professor Natal Ayiga, the Director of the Kabale University Directorate of Research and Publications. Since arriving in early January, he has reviewed both academic research article submissions and draft proposals and concept papers prepared by both Faculty and graduate students.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE GOVERNOR EMMANUEL TUMUSIIME MUTEBILE BY THE VICE CHANCELLOR



The Kabale University Chancellor, Prof. Mondo Kagonyera, together with the Vice Chancellor Prof. Joy C Kwesiga, and some members of the University Management, pay their last respects to KAB's Chief Fund Raiser, the late Governor of the Central Bank, Prof. Emmanuel Tumusiime Mutebile during the Memorial Service on the 30th of January 2022 in Kigezi.

As an off-spring of the Christian Revival of Kigezi, I start this tribute with the confession that since I heard of the passing on of Prof. E. T Mutebile, I have been complaining to God, wondering why, why, and why; because of late, key founders and promoters of Kabale University (KAB) are being plucked from our midst at a fast rate. Just to mention but a few: we lost Dr Joseph B. Byamugisha (First Chairperson of the University Council), Hon. Manzi Tumubweinee (Third Chairperson of the University Council), Eng. Ezekiel Balaba (First Chairperson of the Assembly of Promoters), Mr Charles Byabakama (Second Chairperson of the Assembly of Promoters), Hon. Avitus Tibarimbasa (Chairperson of the Steering Committee which planned for the establishment of KAB), and Justice Amos Twinomujuni (Second Chairperson of the Board of Trustees). Now comes the bombshell of losing the KAB Chief Fund Raiser!

The Governor, for that, is his name (as opposed to title) within the Kigezi community, has left a legacy in many aspects of life in Uganda and beyond. Many have already and continue to articulate his contribution to the economy of Uganda. However, my obligation, and privilege, is to enlighten the public, as I applaud him, about his ability and success in building institutions. From this perspective, and without doubt, the late Prof. Mutebile occupies a special place in the founding and building of Kabale University.

When the Kigezi Development Association resolved to start a university, to be owned by the people of Kigezi, there was no clear source of funding. Members contributed whatever they

could. This was quickly spent on initial renovations of the premises inherited from Kabale District Local Government. Professor Mutebile embarked on hosting a series of fund-raising drives to keep the university running. More buildings were improved, and the first vehicle, a 14-seater van, to run errands was secured, among other purchases.

In 2005, there was a concerted effort to recruit a Vice Chancellor who might perhaps stay longer than the short spells my three predecessors had spent in Kabale over the short period of less than three years. Consequently, Prof. Emmanuel Tumusime Mutebile, Dr Joseph Byamugisha, and Justice Prof. George W. Kanyeihamba persuaded me to have a go. They promised to top up my salary from their individual earnings. It actually ended up by being the salary, rather than top up. In order to make me move, Prof. Mutebile gave me a cheque to cover his six-month contribution - and off I went. When the situation became tighter, he was able to fundraise for my salary for another eight months. He periodically sponsored me, from his own pocket, so that as Vice Chancellor, I could attend Kigezi gatherings, to market the University, particularly regarding the meetings of the International Community of Banyakigezi (ICOB) - in the USA, the UK, and Canada. His Office and Home remained open to us, whenever we needed advice and other forms of assistance. For example, when I needed to tap into the Presidential Science Fund for the construction of a Science Lecture Hall Block, he not only made an opening for me to explain the need to the Secretary to the Treasury, but also surrendered his luxurious Governor's Vehicle to me so that I could fit into the PS/SP's schedule! The trip was, of course, super comfortable, and it yielded dividends.

He was the KAB Chief Fund Raiser, not just because he was Governor of the Central Bank. The underlying factor was his talent and character, which made him a unifying and respected leader for the people of Kigezi. I recall one such occasion when two politicians who had sworn not to talk to each other found themselves simultaneously entering Prof. Mutebile's home where the function was to take place. They had no choice but greet each other, to the applause of the rest of us in the audience. There are many varying interests amongst the people of Kigezi, many of them very divisive, but he managed to transcend these and earn the trust of the majority.

It is for his attributes that when the International Community of the Banyakigezi was ready to form the Ugandan Chapter, there was no other person appropriate for this position, but Prof. Mutebile. Once the Chapter was established, and a Patron was required, no other name came forward. I believe his role here will be articulated elsewhere. Here, I can only comment on the decisive manner in which he chaired these meetings, often not in a peaceful environment, but he was able to take command and sail through, and none would complain.

Prof. Mutebile was visionary, for how else could he have earned the title of the Architect of the Recovery of Uganda's Economy? In the case of Kabale University, he supported the idea of establishing what we call the Bank of Uganda Chair of Economics. The Promoters submitted a formal request to BOU. As a result, the Bank makes an annual contribution of UGX 50 million for the promotion of the discipline of Economics - his speciality. In these early stages, Kabale University was not the first port of call for many academicians. It was not easy to recruit a Professor of Economics to occupy this Chair, as was required. We could only persuade someone at the level of Senior Lecturer! The Governor invited me to his Office and gave me a stern warning. In his own words he stated, *"I do not want to live a lie. Either you get a Professor, or you forfeit this money"*. As fate would have it, our Guardian Angel directed the late Professor

George Alibaruho, a renowned Economist of international repute, to Kabale! We are thankful that the funding has continued to-date.

Prof. Mutebile has also cemented his leadership because of being a man of the people. He relates to all, down to the level of those running *Bufunda* businesses. Many times, I have interacted with youths who waylay him when he visits his home in Kabale or Bunyonyi. Once they catch his eye, he has been able to talk with them and guide, advise, and many times give a hand. There are some youth groups that I am associated with - as a mentor and I have in the past introduced some of them to the Governor. In fact, I have, in my possession, proposals that such groups had requested me to pass on to him, because they argued, that although they know him, he may not be accessible to them by virtue of his job.

Prof. Mutebile's achievements are underlined by a high level of generosity. Every other mourner confirms this. In the process, he introduced a number of youths he had supported to complete their education, here and abroad. I commended his generosity, but he was quick to explain that if he had not been helped by philanthropists in his earlier years, he would not be where he was. It was a duty to reciprocate. This is a big lesson for us Ugandans.

We have lost a pillar, an institution builder, a community mobiliser, a generous and cautious man of integrity - expressing all these through action, humour and song.

On behalf of Kabale University, and on my own behalf, I wish to convey our heartfelt condolences to the family, the people of Kigezi and Uganda, for this great loss. We can only celebrate his excellent service to society, as we have a lot to emulate. My deepest condolences go to Mrs Betty K. Mutebile, for fulfilling her vows. She has constantly provided the support needed, and as a woman, I commend her most highly and hope and pray that God will provide the strength for her to go through this very difficult time.



Fare thee well, Prof. E T Mutebile, the benefactor of many! May his soul rest in eternal peace.

KABSOM TRAINS RUKIGA, RUBANDA, KABALE & TORORO DISTRICT HEALTH WORKERS IN CANCER SCREENING AND TREATMENT

Kabale University School of Medicine in partnership with Rotary Club International and Kabale Regional Referral Hospital launched a week-long cervical screening training workshop for some health workers from the Kigezi districts of Rukiga, Rubanda, Kabale, and Tororo.

TRAINING

KABSOM together with Rotary international and the rotary club of Kabale trained health workers from the Districts of Kabale, Rubanda Rukiga and Tororo in cervical cancer screening and treatment The Launch took place on Saturday 19th of February 2022 at Kabale University School of Medicine (KABSOM) hostels in Makanga.

Dr. Godwin Turyasingura, the Acting Dean, KABSOM, gave an overview of the project in his opening remarks. He pointed out that in order to write this project, the team under the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology was motivated by the overwhelming numbers of women who were reporting to hospitals late with cervical cancer which was already in advanced stages and beyond the manageable levels. At this stage, they could hardly do much besides giving only palliative care. As a team, they were concerned and compelled to write a proposal of training health workers first within Kabale Regional Referral Hospital, a project that was done in 2018 with support from Kabale University. Dr. Turyasingura says, once cervical cancer is detected early, it can be treated and managed.

This project was piloted way back in 2019 by training health workers from health centres from rural areas with support from Worldwide Healing Hands. At that time, fifteen (15) health workers were trained and cervical cancer screening started at those health centres were those trained health workers were coming from. But it was realized that once it's done at the regional level, a small proportion will benefit. In continuation to this, the department sought support to train more hospital staff in cervical cancer screening and training.

This project is to train health workers from different health centres across the Districts of Rukiga, Rubanda, and Kabale. Dr. Turyasingura said "in this project, two health workers from thirty-two (32) health centres from the 3 districts were trained in two phases", after the training, KABSOM Team will continue to follow them up and supervise them at their respective health centres. Turyasingura believes that after this training the number of mothers visiting health centres for screening will increase and the life of our mothers will be enjoyable.

He called upon well-wishers who can further support this project to support the mobilization of communities so that they can utilize the services at different levels to come on board.

this project, few In а participants from Tororo Districts were attracted to the program, they requested to participate and they were allowed. He thanked Rotary Club International through Rotary Club of Kabale for accepting to support this project.

While addressing the audience at the launch, the Health Officer Kabale District Dr. Alfred Besigensi thanked Kabale University for initiating and coordinating the project. commended He Rotary International for supporting the training. He said that from the recent statistics, 90% of women from developing countries die because of cancer of the cervix. He said cancer of the cervix if diagnosed early is preventable and simple skills are needed in its screening process. He was very grateful for the support and called upon those who can to also think of supporting the treatment of other underlying health conditions. He called upon his fellow health workers who were chosen for the training not to hide the skills they will have obtained after the training.

Dr. Hilary Ahaisibwe, who represented the Director Kabale Regional Referral Hospital welcomed participants to the training. He thanked the Rotary Team and Kabale University School of Medicine for the noble activity that was being embarked on of serving our people in the region. He said the to participants that the skills that will be passed to you will not only benefit and empower you to serve the communities properly. He re-echoed the need to fund the mobilization of mothers so that numbers coming to receive the services of cancer screening can increase at health centres.

The University Bursar Mr. Gad Twesigye represented the Vice Chancellor at the Launch. He thanked Rotary Club International and Rotary Club of Kabale for supporting this project, He said the University Management was excited about this entire project and appreciated Dr. Turyasingura for spearheading the Project. He said the eradication of cancer is one of the major areas Rotary supports worldwide. He reiterated the University 's commitment to partner with Rotary on many other similar projects in order to help our communities. He congratulated the participants because of the opportunity to attend this training. He said, this will increase the health centres capacity in cervical cancer screening excises.

The event was graced by the Rotary District 9214 Governor, Rotarian Peace Taremwa who launched the training. The District Governor thanked Kabale University for taking the lead in the project, he further proposed phasing of the project such that the project can be carried to other regions, for instance, covering the entire region of Kigezi, Greater Ankole, the western part of Uganda and later the entire country. He said that "Let us see the project that has started in Kabale grow to spread to other regions of the country, we need to always refer to this model that has started from Kabale"

Rotarian Peace Taremwa the Rotary district Governer commended Kabale University for conducting this training. He revealed that rotary international is in the advanced stages of providing village ambulances throughout the country and said discussions with the Ministry of health are ongoing for a tax waiver for those items. He called upon members to join Rotary club international so that we join hands and move together to eradicate cancer throughout the world.

Mr. Peace Taremwa handed over one Thermocoagulators to the representative of the Kabale Regional referral Hospital during the launch of the training that lasted a whole week.

Scroll through to choose the appropriate **Entry Scheme** and click <u>Apply now</u> again After filling in the online form, click <u>Submit</u>

To pay application fee, click <u>Pay for Form</u> to generate the <u>Zeepay Reference Number</u>. One can present the number to any **bank** or **bank agent** and pay <u>50,000=</u> plus a <u>bank charge</u>, or use Mobile Money pay method.

B. For application by completing a hardcopy form:


